We serve lunch and coffee in the old fashioned restaurant/ café. The bison are strolling proudly in the enclosures while you enjoy you lunch or coffee in our tranquil garden. If it rains you're welcome to relax indoors as well.

Opening hours

The park is open every day, except on Mondays. From 10:00 a.m. to 16:00 p.m.

During weekends you have the possibility to enjoy guided tours of the park. Every Saturday and Sunday at 11:00 a.m. and 14:00 p.m. there's guides available to give you a very interesting tour. The price is 25 SEK per person (above the normal entrance fee).

News of 2011

There's a lot of new stuff. Here's a few of them: a marvelous exhibition of photos in the barn, guided tours through your mobile phone, playground for the kids and the first part of the observation deck is ready. Another great thing this year is that when you pay the full entrance fee of 70 SEK, you will automatically get a season ticket. This means that you can visit the park as many times you want, for the summer of 2011.
